

## St Luke's School Data Plan 2026



At St Luke's, we are committed to continuous school improvement. We use evidence to identify, monitor and respond to all student needs and our strategic priorities. The table below outlines our plan to address our strategic priorities through the collection, analysis and discussion of our school and student learning data and how we use and communicate this across our community.

At St Luke's we support the use of the School Improvement Tool (SIT) by giving high priority to school-wide analysis and discussion of systematically collected data on student outcomes, including academic, attendance and behavioural outcomes, and student wellbeing.1 St Luke's collects and analyses a broad range of student learning and wellbeing data to inform learning and teaching cycles and whole school progress and performance.

We identify gaps in student learning and wellbeing, monitor student improvement over time, monitor growth across the years and inform the implementation of strategies that improve student outcomes. Central to the collection of this data is the consideration of school-wide data literacy and the processes and practices that support quality teaching and learning. Staff are able to access data through the Business Intelligence (BI) tool and other authority and evidence-based sources, to support analysis, discussion and implementation of strategies that will improve student outcomes. In developing and implementing a data plan, consideration of an overall school schedule of learning, teaching and wellbeing data is outlined in the plan below. Clear specification of types of data to be collected, performance measures to be achieved, sources of data that best reflect those outcomes, the timeframe, lines of responsibility, analysis processes and actions to be implemented, are essential elements in the data plan and will also support the tracking of the school's explicit improvement agenda.
